



SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2017 REGATTA SERIES

Lake Dillon, Colorado

1. RULES

- 1.1. These regattas will be governed by the rules as defined by the 2017-2020 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. Class rules shall apply except as changed by these Sailing Instructions (SI). The Dillon Yacht Club is the Organizing Authority (OA).
- 1.3. Add to RRS: 41 (e) help to recover from the water and return on board a crew member provided the return on board is at the approximate location of the recovery.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1. Notices to Competitors will be posted on the official notice board on the side of the DYC Clubhouse.
- 2.2. Any changes to these sailing instructions will be posted before 1 PM on the day it will take effect, except any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 5 PM on the day before it will take effect.

3. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 3.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed from the DYC flagstaff on the south side of the DYC clubhouse.
- 3.2. When code flag "AP" is displayed ashore, the first warning signal will be no sooner than 30 minutes after lowering the AP flag.

4. SCHEDULE

- 4.1. Registration: 1 PM on the day of each race. A competitors meeting may be held at 1 PM on the first day of each regatta.

- 4.3. Number of races: 8 Races per regatta are scheduled. Races will be sailed back to back.
- 4.4. Unless posted otherwise, the scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day will be 2 PM.
- 4.5. No races will be started after 5:00 PM on Saturdays and 4:30 PM on Sunday.
5. CLASS FLAGS
- 5.1. Class flags and the order of starts for the first race of each day will be announced at the competitor's meeting and posted on the Official Notice Board within 15 minutes of the conclusion of the competitor's meeting.
6. RACING AREA
- 6.1. Attachment 1 shows the racing area.
7. COURSES AND MARKS
- 7.1. The DYC fixed marks are white cylinders approximately 4 feet high and 8 inches in diameter, and numbered 1-12, as shown on Attachment 1.
- 7.2. An inflatable mark may be used for an Offset, Windward, Gybe, or Leeward mark. When used, this mark will be identified as "O", "W", "G" or "L" by the RC Signal Boat.
- 7.3. The RC shall post the marks to be rounded and the order in which they are to be rounded.
- 7.4. All marks shall be rounded to port, unless underlined or posted in GREEN, in which case they shall be rounded to starboard.
- 7.5. To change the next leg of the course the RC may change the position of the next mark(s) or change the mark that is to be rounded by signaling with a "C" flag and repeated sounds, and posting the new and subsequent marks to be rounded. If the RC signal boat also displays class flags (numeral pennants), the change of course ONLY applies to those fleets.
8. STARTING AND FINISHING LINES
- 8.1. Starts
- 8.1.1. Races will be started using RRS 26.
- 8.1.2. The start line will be between the staff with an orange flag on the Committee Signal Boat and a nearby mark. This may be an inflatable mark.
- 8.1.3. A boat starting later than five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4.
- 8.1.4. Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.
- 8.2. Recalls
- 8.2.1. Recalls will be made in accordance with RRS 29.1 or 29.2.
- 8.2.2. An attempt to notify premature starters may be made with a loud hail and/or over channel 69.
- 8.2.3. Failure to hear the hail will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 8.2.4. If a start has a General Recall, the warning signal for the NEXT starting class will be one minute after the removal of the First Substitute. The general recalled class will move to the

end of the starting sequence. All other starts will remain in the same order. This modifies RRS 29.2.

8.3. Finishing

8.3.1. The finish line will be between a line flag on the Race Committee Finish Boat and a nearby mark which may be an inflatable mark.

8.3.2. The Race Committee may, at their discretion, finish between a mark and a fixed location with a flag displayed (such as a dock or pier). This changes SI 8.3.1

9. TIME LIMITS

9.1. The time limit for the first boat in class to start, correctly sail the course and to finish will be 90 minutes.

9.2. The race committee may give any boat not finishing within 30 minutes of the first boat in that class, a finishing place or estimation for her time for a finish. This is at the discretion of the Race Committee and is not grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

10. PROTESTS

10.1. Upon finishing a race, protesting yachts must notify the RC of its intent to file a protest from a violation occurring in that race.

10.2. Protest forms will be available at the DYC Club house. Protests must be received by the OA, DYC Race Chairman, or RC Principal Race Officer within 30 minutes from the time the RC boat docks for the day.

10.3. A Code Flag "B" will be hoisted with one sound shortly after the RC Signal Boat docks, and will be lowered, with one sound, at the expiration of the protest filing time.

10.4. Protests and Arbitration will be heard in the DYC clubhouse.

10.5. Parties to the protest must supply a cell phone contact and remain in the area until called.

10.6. RRS Appendix T5 will be used for Arbitration.

11. SCORING

11.1. RACE SCORES: Races will be scored according the RRS A2 with the following modifications: There will be one throw-out after four races.

11.2. PHRF scoring will use the Sailing Association of Intermountain Lake PHRF time on time correction using the formula:

$$\text{Corrected time} = 715 / (515 + \text{PHRF Handicap}) * \text{Elapsed time.}$$

11.3. MATCH RACE SCORING: Match Races will be scored using RRS Appendix C10

11.4. Any boat that has not paid its racing fees will not be scored.

12. PRIZES

12.1. Weekend regatta acknowledgement on the DYC Clubhouse Display will be presented to the winner of each "fleet" (see NOR 4.1 for class fleets) based on the number of registered entries for that individual regatta.

12.2. DYC Summer Series prizes will be presented to the top 3 finishing boats in each fleet (see NOR 4.1 for eligible class fleets) and will be awarded by the OA at the DYC Awards Banquet.
